Commissioner Chris Jackson Posts Strong Numbers In District 10 Signature Campaign

Today, the Department of Elections ("DOE") announced that Chris Jackson's District 10 campaign had collected 904 signatures, including 802 valid signatures from registered voters in District 10.

Signatures in lieu are gathered by supervisorial candidates to offset the \$500.00 filing fee. Gathering signatures is widely seen as a show of campaign strength, and although Jackson was one of the most recent candidates to enter the race, his numbers far exceeded his fellow candidates. He came in second to his closest competitor by a margin of 154 signatures. No other candidate made it past the 500 mark.

Unlike other campaigns, Chris Jackson's campaign announced that his signature gathering effort was done completely by volunteers; no paid signature gatherers were used.

"District 10 is a difficult group of neighborhoods to petition gather in," said Jackson. "We made it a point to register voters whenever we could, especially in neighborhoods that have been traditionally underrepresented in City Hall. It was important for us to outreach beyond the voter-rich Portrero Hill area."

Chris Jackson, who currently serves as Trustee on the San Francisco Community College Board, is the only elected official running for the District 10 seat. He is widely regarded as a leading candidate in the race to succeed Sophie Maxwell as Supervisor.
